**GROUP SUES U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS FOR FAILING  
TO RELEASE DOCUMENTS RELATING TO DESTRUCTION  
OF WETLANDS IN THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER BASIN**

On behalf of the Missouri Coalition for the Environment, Great Rivers Environmental Law Center filed suit in federal district court in Washington, D.C., on Monday, September 23, 2013, against the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers over the Corps' failure to release any information relating to several permits the Corps issued allowing permit applicants to destroy wetlands of the Mississippi River Basin.

The Missouri Coalition for the Environment ("MCE") seeks the documents in order to determine whether the permit applicants who were allowed to destroy wetlands actually followed through on their promises to preserve, restore and create compensatory wetlands to replace the public resources that were taken.

MCE filed requests for documents from the Corps under the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") in June, July and August of 2013. The Corps released none of the documents. "The Corps is required by law to release these documents," said Brook Spear, Great Rivers' attorney for MCE. "People have the right to see whether permit applicants are preserving, restoring and creating the wetlands they say they will."

"If the Corps had nothing to hide about the projects it would have released the documents immediately," said Heather Navarro, Executive Director of MCE. "The Corps has allowed developments to destroy almost all of the Mississippi Rivers' wetlands; the Corps is required by law to follow-up with the permit applicants to make sure they create the new wetlands they promise. The George H. W. Bush administration promised 'no net loss of wetlands;' Americans have the right to know how their taxpayer supported agencies are performing on their promises."

The Mississippi River is one of America's most endangered rivers, having lost almost all of its wetlands and floodplains to development as well as being the repository for many industrial pollutants.
